Riceville Church Leadership

Church History







The Riceville Mount Olive Baptist Church was organized in a, "Brush Arbor," on March 11, 1889, by Rev. John L. Lilly, with a membership of eight. The first members were: Isaiah Jackson, Sophia Edwards, Mary Rice, Simmom McCode, Susie Marshall, Vinia Marshall, Rocksanna Rice and Diana Jackson. On October 11, 1889, a developer, John Ruby, donated land for the church and burial grounds on the back of Keegans Bayou. (The Riceville Cemetery is currently on the same property with the address of 9945 Honeywell Road). After several meetings and many discussions, Jake Rice, the longest community resident with eight members, decided Rev. John Lilly would be the official Pastor and the church was named Riceville. Rev. Lilly served as Pastor for twenty years until his death. He was next Pastor of Riceville for sixteen years. During the year of 1916, the church was blown down by a storm. Rev. Griffin took on the task of constructing a larger Riceville church

Rev. Lee Moton served as an interim Pastor for

Rev. T. H. Shermann was called by Riceville and under his pastoralship, twelve feet of new construction was added to the Church building. The Christian Union was established and is a viable organization of the Riceville Mount Olive Baptist Church today. Due to health issues, Rev. Shermann resigned after seven years of loyal leadership. In 1942, Rev. Travis Spiller was called to serve as Pastor. In an effort to build the membership, Riceville church services were changed to every Sunday instead of the customary second and fourth Sundays. Continuing under the guidance of Rev. Spiller, a new Church building was erected in 1944 by Rev. C. H. Mitchell, son of Deacon John E. Mitchell. The church was fully paid-off in 1947. Rev. Spiller saw a need for a cafeteria and Rev. Mitchell constructed two stories of succeeded by, Rev. I. Griffin, who served as the past Pastor of Riceville for sixteen years. additional building space to the existing church edifice. The Riceville Audio Video Ministry serves God and the congregations by enhancing the worship experience through video and sound recording, mass communications and social media engagement. Church Corporate Updates From the Pastoral Search Committee

A **Pastor Search Committee** (PSC) has been formed and commissioned to begin the process of securing GOD's new Senior Pastor for Riceville. The PSC consist of a cross section of members from the Church body. The PSC has been affirmed by the congregation at a duly called church meeting. It should be encouraging to all to know that Riceville has gone through this process before, so we have tried and true guidelines to follow. Below is and update from the committee.

Update for the PSC

The Pastoral Search Committee (PSC) consist of nine (9) voting members – Anthony Hawkins (Chair), C. K. Phillips (Co-Chair), Sylvia Mercy (Secretary), Mildred Jenkins-Williams (Assistant Secretary), Donald Cage, Dee Mitchell, Jerry Hughes, Carol Martin, Kenneth Butler, and 3 alternative members – Demetria Diggs, Carolyn Payton, and Shenee Wade.

The Senior Pastor job posted December 12, 2022 - February 28, 2023. There were one hundred thirty-eight (138) resume packets submitted. Once the job posting closed, the PSC began Phase II. Phase II included verifying the contents of each resume packet. Applicants that did not submit all of the required documents were notified by email and given an opportunity to submit the documents prior to the job posting deadline. There was a total of fifty-nine (59) Resume packets that did not submit all of the required documents by the deadline. These applicants were notified by email advising they would not be considered for the next phase of this process.

The PSC proceeded to the next step of Review/Evaluate with the remaining seventy-nine (79) applicants resumes/sermons. Once that process was completed, the committee begin the rating/ranking process for potential final Pastoral Candidates. Many of you have asked the following questions: "When will we get a pastor?" or "When will the congregation get to hear pastoral candidates?". The PSC assures the congregation, we are being thorough in this process and seeking God's guidance through fasting and prayer. During the month of April, the PSC met two Thursdays (4 hours) and two Saturdays (9 hours). In an effort to complete the final phases, the Committee met every Thursday (19 hours) and two Saturdays (6 hours) during the month of May and June. The PSC will continue to maintain this monthly meeting schedule as the need requires. Undates of the PSC's progress is provided monthly to the Deacon Board and requires. Updates of the PSC's progress is provided monthly to the Deacon Board and congregation.

- Additional steps of Phase II process include:
 Selecting perspective Pastoral Candidates based on matrix ranking.
- Establish and maintain an interview schedule for candidates.
- Conduct initial interviews of candidates.
- Establish consensus on the best candidates that will be recommended to the church

body.

Review with the Deacon Board candidates that will be recommended to the church body.

- Coordinate with Deacons and Trustees to develop a compensation package for Pastoral position.
- Coordinate with the Pulpit Supply Committee to schedule candidates to preach Sunday Service and teach Bible Study.
- Provide the congregation with each candidates' resume as they preach Sunday Service and teach Bible Study.

Phase III:

Once the PSC is ready to make a recommendation to the Church, the congregation will be assembled in a called or regular business meeting by the Deacons to review the

- If the candidate receives the necessary two-thirds (2/3) majority votes, the PSC and/or Deacon Board will inform both the congregation and the candidate of the call.

 • The candidate will have thirty (30) days to accept or decline the position as Pastor.
